Burning will be allowed in designated areas with a Low or Moderate fire Danger Rating upon approval and violations will result in a maximum fine of \$1,000.00. Tax Director Hanson gave an update on the Township Equalization Meetings. Tax Director Hanson stated 10 out of the 46 townships have denied the 2017 assessing values.

Dustin Roise spoke about discrepancies on the valuations on land.

Charlie Sorenson stated the County is not following the law by not including the three criteria's soil type, modifiers, and land use. Charlie Sorenson suggested the county hold off on implementing soils and develop a soils board for next year.

Tax Director Hanson stated the law does not require land use.

Fred Evans suggested the County use land use when assessing and implementing the soils.

Tax Director Hanson stated decisions will be made at the County Equalization Meeting on June 6, 2017.

Traci Hysjulien, Clerk of Court, informed the board that due to the office currently being understaffed overtime is needed in order to fulfill state mandated requirements.

Moved by Comm. Johnson, seconded by Comm. Uran, to approve overtime for the Clerk of Courts Office. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Johnson, seconded by Comm. Jacobson, to approve the Temporary Employee Agreement for Hannah Hetzel for the Clerk of Court Office totaling \$19.00 per hour from June 2017 to August 2017 and shall not exceed 40 hours per week and no more than 720 hours per year. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Johnson, seconded by Comm. Uran, to approve the salary increase for Madison Christenson from the Clerk of Courts Office totaling \$4,115.00 per month for successful completion of probationary period. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on a cash drawer for the Clerk of Courts Office.

Melissa Vachal Recorder, Traci Hysjulien Clerk of Court, Lori Hanson Tax Director, Laurie Johnson Jail Administrator, Jana Heberlie Engineer, Lisa Lee Planning & Zoning Administrator, Karen Babbitt Head Custodian, Garrett Volk IT Coordinator, Corey Bristol Chief Deputy, Shawna McFarland Social Services Director, and Jim Hennessey Ag Agent met with the Board to discuss the Kronos System. The Board was concerned about all of the manual entries for the time clock.

Jana Heberlie, Road & Bridge Engineer, met with the Board to discuss issues with the Road and Bridge Department along with Mary Trahan, Administrative Assistant.

Engineer Heberlie stated Oasis has requested permission to improve a section line located in Section 12, Township 154 North, Range 94 West (Unorganized Township). Present for the discussion from Oasis was Katelynn Weiss and Damon Jorgensen. Engineer Heberlie stated the hydrology analysis was completed and the plans do meet the County specifications.

Moved by Comm. Ruland, seconded by Comm. Johnson, to approve the request of Oasis to improve a section line in Section 12, Township 154 North, Range 94 West (Unorganized Township) contingent upon a maintenance agreement and landowner approval. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Ruland, seconded by Comm. Jacobson, to approve the crushing agreement for the Lapica Pit with Farden Construction, Inc. to crush up to 50,000 cubic yards of class 13 aggregate for one year and will pay for the amount crushed only. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Jacobson, seconded by Comm. Johnson, to approve the addition of Crowfoot Township to the Uniform County Truck Permit System. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the Western Dakota Energy Association Uniform County Agreement. Administrative Assistant Trahan presented the Board with 4 options. Option A allocates 25% of certified miles to the townships. Option B allocates 25% of township miles traveled to the township. Option C allocates 75% of the fees collected to the Township(s) upon which the travel occurred. Option D allocates 60% of travel on township miles only to the township.

Moved by Comm. Ruland, seconded by Comm. Johnson, to approve Option C, to allocate 75% of the fees collected to the Township(s) upon which the travel occurred. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Jacobson, seconded by Comm. Uran, to approve the Permanent Approach Permit for Slawson Exploration on CR15 in Section 29, Township 152 North, Range 91 West (Van Hook Township) pending the installation of the proper signage, pre and post inspections, and to repair any damage. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Engineer Heberlie requested an additional Engineering Tech be hired or make the current Engineering Tech a salaried position because of the excess overtime. The Board decided neither option would work due to the additional Tech position not in the 17 budget and the job classification does not fall into the ranking of a salaried position.

Engineer Heberlie stated the material testing on CR 9, White Earth Valley Road, came in higher than was quoted.

Discussion was held on trees on CR 4, 74th St NW, that are hanging over into the ROW and creating issues.

Discussion was held on the Mountrail County roads that will be utilized for a McLean County water depot.

Auditor Pappa gave a financial update.
