Protection against Retaliation and Reprisal

It is unlawful to retaliate against an employee for filing a complaint of sexual any harassment or for cooperating in an investigation of a complaint for sexual any harassment. Mountrail County will not tolerate reprisal against an individual who in good faith, report or provides information in an investigation about behavior that may violate this policy. Intentionally providing false information however is grounds for dismissal.

Moved by Comm. Uran, seconded by Comm. Hollekim, to approve the finalized employee handbook Harassment Policy 513. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Deputy Treasurer Degenstein also discussed the Human Resource Department Job Position. Stephanie A. Pappa, Auditor expressed concern that there may be offices that are overstaffed. Unorganized Townships were discussed for the upcoming 2019 budget and what to do with the unexpended balance of the revenues produced in each of the Unorganized Township. The following revenues for Oil & Gas, Taxes and Flood Aid will have to be divided into the different unorganized township funds and will be kept within those funds for the 19 budget year. Unorganized 153-94 will stay under the County Road and Bridge fund due to all township being inundated with water.

Discussion was also held on the Belden Chuck wagon (aka Belden Stop) plat which is a metes and bounds that is in the process of being platted. State's Attorney Wade Enget stated it should have the ROW for the County on CR 10 and the NDDOT for Highway 8 so best to pay for the two plats to clear up the ROW discrepancies.

Moved by Comm. Olson, seconded by Comm. Uran, to approve paying for North side of the CR 10 of the Belden Chuck wagon for Right of Way for Mountrail County. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.
