- What was your purpose or focus with the exhibit?
- What did you wish to learn?
- What do you want the judge to know or evaluate?
 - a. The building/engineering process? (Ex. Woodworking, Welding, Cake Baking)
 - b. The creative/decoration process? (Wood Arts, Welding Arts, Cake Decorating)

Once you know these answers you will have an easier time selecting the correct Division & Class for your exhibit.

Additional Registration Notes

- Enter **DETAILED** descriptions.
- Mountrail Co. Achievement Days follows all criteria & guidelines set in the ND State Fair Book. Please see book for info on # of exhibits allowed per division/class & such. This rule does <u>NOT</u> apply to Cloverbud Static Exhibits. You may enter as many Static exhibits as you wish to.
- After submitting your exhibits, you will be locked out of your account until the 4-H Office approves those exhibits. You can add more exhibits up to the June 26th deadline.
- <u>BUYERS SUPPER/BAKED GOODS</u>: While registering your Food & Nutrition exhibits you will be asked if you exhibit can be used for the Premium Sale Buyers Supper. Select **YES** or **NO** when prompted. An **ORANGE** sticker will be placed on the exhibit tag for those who answer YES.

This year you must submit a **paper form** to the Mountrail County 4-H Office for all Static & Livestock exhibits you wish to advance to the ND State Fair. Since many of our exhibitors deliver their own projects, this is our way to ensure we know which qualifying projects need promoted per ND State Fair/4-H policy. The State Fair is charged for every exhibit that is promoted, but does not end up participating.

** Cloverbud Static or Livestock cannot advance to the State Fair.

REQUIREMENTS TO PROMOTE EXHIBIT TO ND STATE FAIR:

- <u>STATIC EXHIBITS</u> Exhibit must be shown at Achievement days. Must also receive a Grand, Reserve, Merit, or Blue ribbon to advance.
- <u>LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS</u> Exhibit must be shown at Achievement Days. **Does not** require a certain ribbon level to advance to State Fair.

ND STATE FAIR NOTES:

- **EXHIBIT TRANSPORTATION** Transportation will be provided for small to medium sized exhibits. We cannot pick up items after ND State Fair, so you will have to make your own arrangements for pick up, see times in state fair book for more info.
- <u>4-H MEMBERSHIP CARD</u> You will be receiving your 4-H membership cards shortly. This card can be used to buy a 4-H season pass for the North Dakota State Fair for \$10.



 <u>STALL/PARKING/CAMP SITE RESERVATIONS</u> - Open Class Registration, Horse Stall Reservation, Camp Site Registration, etc.) are to be submitted <u>by the exhibitor</u> and can be found on their website: <u>https://ndstatefair.com/exhibit/4-h-ffa/</u>

Reminder: Read through the ND State Fair Exhibit Book in detail before taking your item so that is meets all guidelines and does not get disqualified!

Achievement Days - Wednesday, July 12

ALL Static and Livestock exhibitors are required to check in on July 12th prior to showing any exhibits.

Check-in with Heather in the Static Judging area!

Steps to Check-In: You will be handed the follow documents at 'Check-In'...

1) TWO copies of exhibits each exhibitor are registered for.

a) Copy #1/Office Copy:

This is where you can see if any changes need to be made or you can delete exhibits that you were unable to complete. New exhibit tags will be issued at this time if needed.

b) Copy #2/Exhibitor Copy:

This is your copy to keep for your records. This will be used to help you with locating your Static Judging locations, ND State Fair submissions and Scissors Award. Keep this handy and no not throw it away!!

2) ND State Fair Static & Livestock Registration Form:

Each exhibitor is required to complete this form by Friday, July 14 by NOON. If this form is not completed, exhibitors' exhibits will NOT be promoted to the ND State Fair. See Pg. 5 for more info on participating at the ND State Fair.

3) Scissors Award Form:

This is awarded based on the number of projects the youth brings and the ribbons they receive. **Every youth is eligible who shows static exhibits.** See pg. ??????? for more info.

Important Note:

NO NEW EXHIBITS ENTRIES WILL BE PERMITTED DURING CHECK-IN

Only updates will be allowed if there is an error on an existing entry card but no new exhibits may be entered past the June 26th deadline.

Supplies & Livestock items can be picked up at check-in table (markers, safety pins, zip ties, small/large livestock cards, exhibitor #'s, etc.)

Static Exhibits Judging - July 12

Static Exhibit - Interview Judging

Static Exhibit interview judging will begin at 3:00 pm on Wednesday, July 12th at the Fair Building in Stanley. There will be stations marked with the types of exhibits that should be taken to them. A 'Check-In' table will be staffed where maps and directions are available. All exhibits must be labeled. We suggest that when exhibitors go to a station, they take all their exhibits for that station with them to eliminate waiting in the same line twice. 4-H'ers and helpers will need to check to see that they are in the right line.

4-H'ers may want to bring their exhibits in boxes or baskets to keep them together.4-H'ers may bring one box or tote with multiple projects into the judging area at a time.Judging stations will close at 6:30 pm on Wednesday evening.

Suggested judging timeslots for each club to begin judging it located on the next page. Please do not wait until 6:30 pm to be judged as that is the start of shutdown time!

Absentee Judging

If a 4-H'er is unable to bring their exhibit to be judged, absentee interview judging forms are available at the office **by request**.

One form must be filled out for each exhibit. There are absentee interview judging forms for both static and livestock exhibits. These forms should be attached to the exhibits and brought to the Fair Building on July 12th for judging.

<u>Note</u>: Only 4-H'ers who are ill, on family vacations or other unavoidable absences may fill out an absentee exhibit form. Projects exhibited with an absentee form cannot receive a ribbon higher than a blue.

Exhibit Staging/Prep Area - Pre-Judging

- There will be staging areas available in the Fair Building static exhibit room for projects to be brought in prior to judging
- Large or heavy exhibit items (large planters, log furniture or other large woodworking project or heavy welding project) are **encouraged** to be brought in early.
- Exhibits need to be in place <u>before</u> judging begins.
- Keep your exhibits in a compacted area to ensure there is room for all exhibits.

Static Exhibit - Judging Times

In an attempt to cut down on the congestion during Static judging please refer to the suggested time slots for each club to begin their judging.

There will be a new club entering the static area every 30 minutes. When you are done judging all of your projects, we ask that you please leave the judging area so that those who are still judging can finish.

<u>Note</u>: If the 4-H'er has a lot of projects and doesn't think they will have enough time to get them all judged, they can come earlier than their club's scheduled time.

Livestock Check-Out

All 4-H members must check out with a Livestock Committee member prior to leaving with their exhibit after the Premium Sale on July 13th (approx. 8pm). Any member who does not do so, will be disqualified for premiums on that exhibit.

Livestock Judging Information

RABBIT exhibitors will be asked to remove their exhibit animals from the cage and present them to the judge on a

carpet covered show table. It will be important that rabbit exhibitors tame and train their projects so that they can easily remove them from the cage and present them to the judge for inspection.

BREEDING CLASSES in all species will be judged before market classes, with the exception of sheep. Separate showmanship classes will be held for junior and senior sheep, dairy, swine, beef, goat, poultry and rabbit exhibitors. You must be registered in a separate showmanship class to participate!

Overall Round Robin

There will be an **Overall Round Robin** showmanship contest in both the JUNIOR (ages 5-12) and SENIOR (ages 13-18) divisions for swine, goat, sheep and beef. Rabbit & Poultry are not part of this event. Dairy may be included if there are 2 registered dairy exhibitor(s) in each division.

Livestock Record Book Judging - July 12

Livestock Record Books - REQUIRED for all species

<u>ALL</u> livestock exhibitors are required to complete a livestock record book for <u>each</u> <u>species</u> they are exhibiting. You may group animals together on a book if they are in the same species/division.

CLOVERBUDS (4-H age 5-7) & REGULAR MEMBERS (4-H ages 8-18) complete different books (more info on next page).

On **July 12** you will do a short interview judging session with the provided judges. You may be awarded a grand, reserve, merit, blue, red, or white ribbon based on the quality of your livestock record book. Only grand, reserve, & merit placings, per species, receive premium points.

You are required to present your Livestock Record Book for **EACH** livestock species check-in. If you have your book judged before your species check-in, your judge will give you a signed form that you must submit during that species check-in.

Failure to submit a livestock record book for any specie will result in that specie not being qualified to be exhibit at the event.



- All exhibitors must wear a solid-colored green, gray, or white shirt/blouse with the 4-H emblem prominently displayed on the front.
- Wear dark jeans/slacks/skirts.
- Boots and protective shoes are recommended for safety.

Exceptions: Clothing Revue, Poultry/Rabbit/Dairy (must wear white long sleeve shirt)

- Submit by July 10th


Each youth member within a family will receive and is required to sell a pack of 10 raffle tickets. Additional tickets are available at the office, if you feel you can sell them.

Please submit your tickets to our office no later than Achievement Days Set-Up (July 11) to ensure that the office can complete the tasks needed for this portion.

Payouts consist of:

- Four winning raffle tickets: Two \$100 value / Two \$50 value
- Four members who sold the winning tickets: \$10 each
- Two 4-H'ers who sold the most tickets: \$25 each

Please do not hand in your ticket money during Achievement Days due to the amount of activities going on during the event.



Premium Sale - Livestock

NEW RULE FOR 2023 – Added to the Premium Sale Criteria Form ALL Premium Sale participants must show at least ONE Static Exhibit. This exhibit must be State Fair eligible (meaning it fits in a class in the ND State Fair Book) or a Cloverbud exhibit.

Participation Requirements & Guidelines

- Limited to one animal in the Premium Sale (Breeding livestock are also eligible for the sale). Must have shown livestock during the current year Achievement Days.
 - Each animal is only eligible to go thru the Premium Sale ONCE. If you are showing the same animal every year, you are not eligible to participate
- Only grand, reserve, blue and red ribbon exhibits will be eligible to participate
- 4-H Dress code is REQUIRED for the Premium Sale.
- Must also be at the minimum sale weight established to be: 900 lbs. for steers; 80 lbs. for market lambs; and 180 lbs. for market swine
- All sale animals will be sold for premium only. Arrangements will need to be made by families to return their livestock home or have it taken to a sales ring or meat processor
- Voted upon by the 4-H Council, a small deduction will be taken from the sale proceeds to cover expenses involved in the Livestock show (judges, auctioneers, exhibit cards and numbers, sale pictures, etc.)
- **LIVESTOCK RECORD BOOKS** and **PREMIUM SALE CRITERIA FORM** are required to be a part of the Premium Sale. Livestock Record Books must also be interview judged & shown at each species check-in.



We will be having the 4-H supper again this year on **July 13 at 5:00 pm**. The purpose of the supper is to show "Buyer Appreciation" to the businesses and individuals who support the livestock Premium Sale. The Mountrail County 4-H Office will supply the steaks, hot dogs and condiments. Once again, this event will be held at the Mountrail County South Complex.

Member Participation Requirements

- 1) Each 4-H family that is involved in the Premium Sale is responsible to bring a GALLON sized salad.
 - a. A \$50 penalty will be deducted from any available premiums for any family that does not provide the item listed above in #1
- 2) Each 4-H club is required to provide two large (18" x 26") pans of bars
 - a. Each Ind. Member is required to bring one large pan of bars
- 3) Other 4-H families are strongly encouraged to bring either a salad or bars to help support Mountrail County 4-H.

BUYERS SUPPER SERVING – We ask that **ALL** clubs help out with this. Please designate a few people to take turns with serving those attending the Buyers Appreciation Supper.

Meal Price & Buyer Appreciation Tickets

Everyone will be able to eat during the supper and we will charge \$4.00 a plate for the steak and \$1.00 a plate for the hotdogs to cover expenses.

The businesses who have purchased a premium in the past couple of years will receive a letter inviting them to the supper, along with a couple buyer meal tickets. If you know of a new buyer who will be attending, please let the office know, so we can send them a ticket for the supper!
