Dress Code

Registration Notes

- 1) Mountrail County Achievement Days follows all criteria & guidelines set in the ND State Fair Book.
- 2) Number of exhibits allowed per Division/Class & Guidelines:

Regular Members (4-H ages 8-18) - Refer to the ND State Fair Exhibit Book

Cloverbuds (4-H ages 5-7) - Allow to enter as many exhibits as desired. All exhibits go in the same class.

No set guidelines to follow for exhibits that are entered.


Add a **DETAILED** description (important for locating your exhibit) *Extremely important if advancing to State*

- 4) After submitting your exhibits, you will be locked out of your account until the 4-H Office approves those exhibits. Call the 4-H office to unlock sooner. You can add more exhibits up to the June 20 deadline.
- 5) Exhibit cards will be mailed to families prior to the event. Changes needed? Contact the 4-H office! No new exhibit entries will be accepted after deadline.

Not sure where to enter your exhibit? Some exhibits entries are easy to determine, others are not. The most important questions to consider when deciding the exhibits proper Division/Class/Lot# is...

- What project categories are you enrolled in on 4-H Online this year?
- What was your purpose or focus with the exhibit?
- What did you wish to learn?
- What do you want the judge to know or evaluate? For example:
- a. The building/engineering process? (Ex. Woodworking, Welding, Cake Baking)
- b. The creative OR decoration process? (Wood Arts, Welding Arts, Cake Decorating)

Once you know these answers you will have an easier time selecting the correct Division & Class for your exhibit!



BUYERS SUPPER/BAKED GOODS:

While registering your Food & Nutrition exhibits you will be asked if your exhibit can be used for the Premium Sale Buyers Supper. Select **YES** or **NO** when prompted.

An ORANGE sticker will be placed on the exhibit tag for those who answer YES.

Static Exhibit Judging - July 7

What is Static Interview Judging?

4-H'ers meet with a judge for approx. 1 - 3 minutes and are asked questions about each of their exhibits! Based on the exhibitors responses and knowledge, the judge awards a ribbon to the exhibitor/exhibit.

Exhibit Arrival/Staging Area

Judging Location: Mountrail County Fair Building Hall

- Exhibit may be brought in prior to your judging time. Fair Building Hall will be open at NOON on July 7.
- A staging area for exhibits will be available to exhibitors to prepare for judging.
- Please give yourself extra time for large/heavy exhibits Early entry for staging available upon request.

Judging

- There are specific marked stations that each exhibit goes to. A 'Check-In' table will be staffed where maps and directions are available. (see pg. 12 for Check-In info)
- All exhibits must have exhibit cards & any special labels they may require.
- When you go to a station, try to take all of your exhibits for that station to eliminate waiting.
 4- H'ers may want to bring their exhibits in boxes or baskets to keep them together.
- Enter your project in the wrong category? Sometimes your judge may ask you to speak with the check-in desk to update your exhibit card and then go to the proper station.

- 1) Who completes them? ALL livestock or animal exhibitors must complete a Record Book for their exhibit(s). 1 book per species.
- 2) How to Register? You must register on FairEntry under each species for the appropriate age division.
- 3) Are they judged? Yes! ALL Record Books will be interview judged on July 9. Sign up for timeslot on July 7.

<u>Showmanship Division:</u> (this is where you can win a belt buckle!)

- 1) What is Showmanship? This is where the youth skills are judged, rather than the livestock they are exhibiting.
- 2) What are the Age Divisions?

Seniors (4-H age 13-18) Junior (4-H age 8-12) Cloverbuds (4-H ages 5-7)

New Age Divisions!

3) How to Register? You must register on FairEntry under each species for the appropriate age division.

Livestock Ownership Deadlines: Market Beef (March 1) - All Other Species (May 1)

<u>Registered Breeds</u> - Must submit proper documents by July 7th or will be moved to Commercial Class.

Round Robin Showmanship Contest

What is a Round Robin Contest? The Grand Champion Showman in each division compete & take turns showing each species to try and earn the title of the Overall Showman in the age division!



Senior & Junior Divisions Only - Recipients win a buckle.

Do I need to participate in Showmanship to possibly qualify? Yes! You have to participate in one or more species & receive the Grand Champion placing to participate in the Round Robin contest in your age division.

You must register your Record Books under each species on FairEntry as an exhibit!

IWHO is required to complete these books?

- 1) ALL Livestock Exhibitors
- ¹2) Horse Exhibitors participating in the Premium Sale I

Youth complete one of these books for **EACH** species they are exhibiting. Can group together per species. Must still keep BREEDING & MARKET in appropriate separate books.

Failure to submit a livestock record book for any specie will result in that specie not being qualified to be exhibit at the event.

WHAT do I do with these when completed? They are interview judged at Achievement Days!

Complete each book in its entirety and you will meet with assigned judges to discuss them.

You may be awarded a grand, reserve, merit, blue, red, or white placing based on the quality of your Livestock record book. Only grand, reserve, & merit placings, per species, receive premium points.

WHEN are they judged?

They are interview judged at Achievement Days!

- During Set-Up on July 7 you will sign-up for the judging timeslot that works the best for you! Failure to sign-up may result in extended wait time.
- On July 9 you will meet with the appropriate judge at the time frame you choose. Those with assigned times will be selected before any who did not sign up on July 7.

WHERE are they judged?

Mountrail County South Complex Hall

Enter the South Complex Hall using the East doors. Signage will be present. There will be specific stations and seating available for EACH species.

WHY do we require these?

The purpose of requiring these record books is to ensure the exhibitor is gaining the fullest experience and knowledge with their animal exhibit. There is so much more that goes into raising livestock than just what you see on show day! These books help educate 4-H youth on a broader level.

Proof of Record Book REQUIRED prior to registering your livestock at the show.

There are TWO options available to complete this task!

- If you have not had your book judged yet, you will show your physical books to each species Superintendent(s) at Check-In.
- 2) No longer have the book(s) in your possession since they have been judged prior to your species Check-In?

If so, when your book is judged ask your specific Livestock Record Book judge to complete a 'Livestock Release Form'. These forms are then put into a box and collected by Livestock Superintendents to review.

<u>Step #2</u> - Exhibit Cards (Update & Delete) - Return unused exhibit cards at this time.

At this time any final exhibit updates can be made. No new exhibits are permitted after June 20.

<u>Step #3</u> - Show Supplies - Pick up your Livestock Exhibitor # and Animal Info Pen signs at this time.

Step #4 - T-Shirts - Pick up any purchased t-shirts that were not previously picked up.

Unable to attend Achievement Days?

You may have options!

If a 4-H'er is unable to bring their exhibit to be judged, absentee interview judging forms are available at the office **by request**.

One form must be filled out for each exhibit. There are absentee interview judging forms for both static and livestock exhibits.

Static Absentee Exhibits:

These forms should be attached to the exhibits and brought to the Fair Building on or by July 7 for judging.

Exhibits are not eligible for Grand or Reserve placings. Only eligible for Blue, Red, or White placings.

Livestock Absentee Exhibits:

Animals must be on location and be shown by another 4-H'er or family member. Absentee forms are to be turned into the check-in area prior to judging.

Exhibits are not eligible for Grand or Reserve placings. Only eligible for Blue, Red, or White placings.

Absentee exhibits are not eligible to participate in the Premium Sale.

Note: Only 4-H'ers who are ill, on family vacations or other unavoidable absences may fill out an absentee exhibit form.

Projects exhibited with an absentee form cannot receive a ribbon higher than a blue.

How do I Participate in the Premium Sale?

<u> ALL SPECIES GUIDELINES:</u>


- 1) Exhibit an animal at 2025 Mountrail County 4-H Achievement Days or Horse Show
- 2) Complete & submit the '2025 Premium Sale Criteria' form by July 7th to the 4-H office.
- 3) Must not have sold the same animal during a prior Premium Sale.
- 4) Must have completed the appropriate Record Book for each species shown at Achievement Days & have it judged during the appointed times on July 9. Youth sign up for their judging timeslots on July 7th during Static Judging.
- 5) Exhibit a minimum of one Static Exhibit (exhibit must fit into a category located in the ND State Fair 4-H Exhibitor Book).
- 6) Confirm the animal you will be entering at Achievement Days at the check-in desk ASAP!

BEEF, DAIRY CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, GOAT, RABBIT, & POULTRY SPECIFIC GUIDELINES:

- 1) IN-PERSON Animal & exhibitor must participate in the sale in-person on July 10th.
- Must receive a red or higher placing at Mountrail Co. 4-H Achievement Days with the animal they choose to participate with in the sale.

New for 2025!

HORSE SPECIFIC GUIDELINES:

- 1) Horse they choose to participate with in the sale must receive blue ribbons in 50% of the Mountrail County 4-H Horse Show classes that they enter and compete within.
- 2) Horses will not be physically present during the sale. **IN-PERSON & ONLINE** participation is required.
- 3) **IN-PERSON** Youth must be present during the Premium Sale and present a photo of them with their Horse in the Premium Sale ring on July 10th.
- 4) VIRTUAL Youth are required to make a video demonstrating their partnership with their Horse. This video will take the place of the horse physically being present in the sale ring.
- Video Deadline June 18, 2025
- 1 to 3 minutes long No guidelines on video content
- 4-H Dress code and Helmets required
- Submit videos via USB thumb drive to Horse Committee members listed or drop them off at the 4-H Office and they will be delivered to a Horse Committee member.

Please submit your tickets to our office no later than Achievement Days Set-Up (July 7) to ensure that the office can complete the tasks needed for this portion.





Mountrail County 4-H

4-H Ribbons Defined

"To make the best better" is the 4-H motto. The project judging experience helps 4-H members evaluate their progress and reflect on how they can improve. The goal is to help young people develop life skills and explore careers.

Consider the following when viewing 4-H projects:

- Judges evaluate each project against a national standard, not against other entries.
- The evaluation system focuses on the development of each 4-H member, not on blue ribbon projects.
- At each level, youth learn to reflect on their accomplishments and consider how to challenge

GRAND CHAMPION



Champion (Purple) - Superior

- First place.
- The exhibit or workmanship is outstanding with minimal flaws. Keep in mind that superior does not mean perfect!

RESERVE CHAMPION



Pink or

Reserve Champion (Lavender) – Above Average

- · Second place.
- Exhibit or workmanship is very good with minimal flaws.

MERIT AWARD



Award of Excellence (Orange) – Above Average

- Exhibits that were considered for the champion rosettes.
- · Exhibit or workmanship is good with minimal flaws.

BLUE AWARD



Blue - Excellent

- · Meets or exceeds the average standard.
- May have one minor fault with little improvements needed.
- Youth set new goals to challenge themselves differently.

RED AWARD



Red – Good

- Meets or is slightly below the average standard.
- · May have some minor and major flaws.
- Youth reflect on what they could change, navigate corrective feedback and establish new goals.

WHITE



White - Fair

- · Does not meet the average standard.
- · Has multiple minor or major flaws.
- Youth practice a growth mindset, reflect on what they could change, navigate corrective feedback, and establish new goals.

CLOWER

Clover Award (Tie Dye) - County Only Ribbon

All Cloverbuds (4-H age 5-7) receive a tie dye ribbon for each Static exhibit they submit into Achievement Days.

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TOP HONOR GRAND <u>CHAMPION</u>



Overall Champion

Awarded by judge(s) to the best exhibit in the division(s)/project area(s) they are judging.

TOP HONOR RESERVE CHAMPION



Overall Champion

Awarded by judge(s) to the second-best exhibit in the division(s)/project area(s) they are judging.
