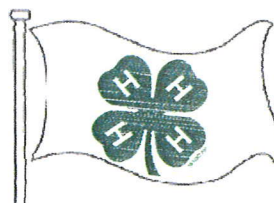
The American Flag Pledge:

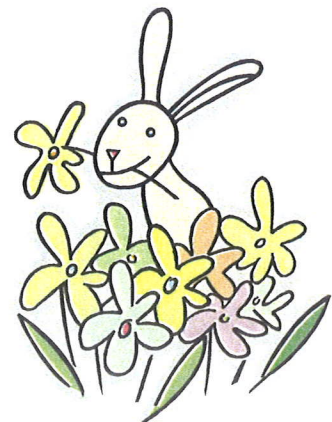

If you bring your rabbit to the fair, you will need to keep its water and food full. You may be able to show your rabbit during the 4-H Rabbit Show. Be sure your rabbit is tame and you can show it correctly and safely.

The judge will look at your rabbit and may ask you some questions. Then he will give you a ribbon. Color this ribbon the same color as the ribbon you want to earn at the fair.



How to Carry Your Rabbit Correctly



To lift a small rabbit you can grab it firmly in the rib section, just in front of the hind quarters.

You can lift small, medium, and large rabbits by grabbing the fold of skin over the rabbits shoulders with one hand and then with the other hand under the rump, lift the rabbit. Keep the feet turned away from you to avoid scratches in case the rabbit struggles. The rabbit may be tucked beneath your arm to help restrain him as you walk.
