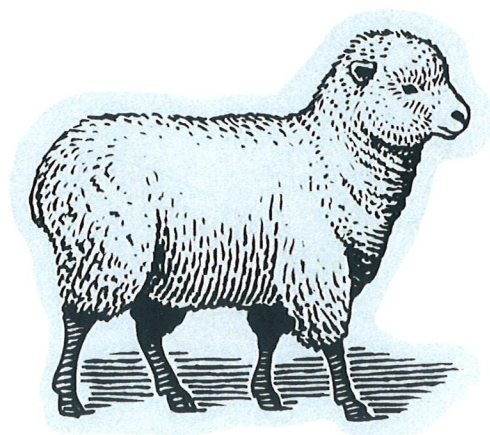

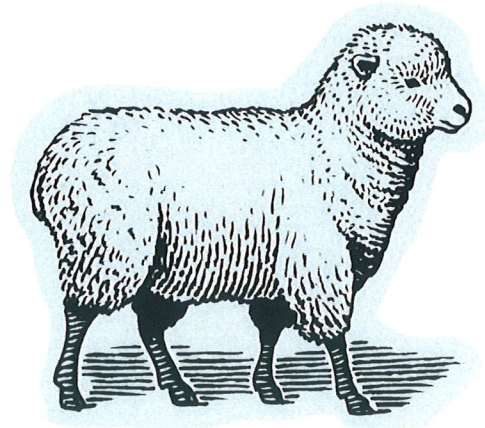

Flag Pledges

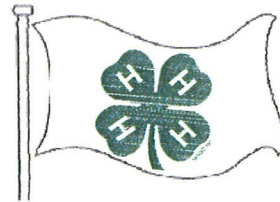
The American Flag Pledge:
