H. WEATHER MODIFICATION RESOLUTION

Moved by Comm. DeGroot, seconded by Comm. Rice, to approve the following resolution to abolish the Weather Modification effective December 31st, 2024:

A Resolution of the Mountrail County Board of Commissioners after results of election held on November 5, 2024, approved the abolishment of the Mountrail County Weather Modification Authority as of December 31, 2024.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.D.C.C. §61-04.1-30, there was presented to the Mountrail County Board of Commissioners a petition signed by not less than twenty percent of the qualified electors of the county, as determined by the vote cast for governor in the last preceding gubernatorial election, requesting an election upon the abolishment of a weather modification authority as created in sections 61-04.1-27 and 61-04.1-29, which petition was presented more than sixty days prior to the next countywide election; and

WHEREAS, upon the finding by the Mountrail County Auditor that said Petition met all applicable statutory requirements within the North Dakota Century Code; and

WHEREAS, based upon that finding, the Mountrail County Board of Commissioners then submitted the question of whether to abolish the Mountrail County Weather Modification Authority to the qualified electors of Mountrail County at the November 5, 2024, countywide election; and

WHEREAS, the results of the election were that there were 2,574 "yes" votes and 1,299 "no" votes cast; and, WHEREAS, the Mountrail County Canvassing Board has certified the results of the November 5, 2024, election according to the applicable provisions of the North Dakota Century Code;

WHEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of N.D.C.C. §61-04.1-30, it is hereby resolved that the Mountrail County Board of Commissioners declares that the Mountrail County Weather Modification shall be abolished as of December 31, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all unexpended funds remaining in the name of the weather modification authority, after all proper bills and expenses have been paid, shall be deposited in the general fund of Mountrail County.

This resolution of the Mountrail County Board of Commissioners was adopted on the 3rd day of December, 2024, at the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

Upon roll call, Ruland, Rice, Olson, Hollekim and DeGroot voted yes. Motion carried.

The joint powers agreement proposes a full-time State's Attorney and a full-time Assistant State's Attorney shared between Burke and Mountrail counties. The Board will have more discussion in the near future pertaining to the proposed joint powers agreement with Burke County.
