1. OPENING & ROLL CALL

The Board met in regular session on Tuesday, March 16, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. in the Emergency/Community Room, Mountrail County Courthouse, Stanley ND with Commissioners Joan Hollekim, Jason Rice, Wayne Olson, Trudy Ruland, and Daniel Uran present. States Attorney, Wade Enget was absent.

Chairman Ruland called the meeting to order.

2. BUSINESS

A. AGENDA

B. MINUTES
