1. LAKE SANISH ADDITION/PARCEL #47-0018800

Nolan Jessop, landowner of Lot 26, Lakeview Addition to Lake Sanish located in Unorganized Township 152 North, Range 93 West met with the Board to discuss building an access road to his property. The County would have to survey before a road could be built.

Moved by Comm. Olson, seconded by Comm. Hollekim, to hire a surveyor to determine the boundary of right of way for a portion of 2nd St NW southeasterly and a portion of 4th Ave NW easterly from Lot 26, Lakeview Addition to Lake Sanish in Unorganized Township 152 North, Range 93 West with surveying costs paid out of the Unorganized Township 152-93 Fund.
