Proceedings of the Mountrail County Commissioners

1. OPENING & ROLL CALL

The Board met in regular session on Thursday, October 7, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. in the Emergency/Community Room, Mountrail County Courthouse, Stanley ND with Commissioners Joan Hollekim, Jason Rice, Wayne Olson, Trudy Ruland, and Daniel Uran present. Also present was State's Attorney, Wade Enget.

Chairman Ruland called the meeting to order.

2. BUSINESS

A. AGENDA

Moved by Comm. Olson, seconded by Comm. Hollekim, to review and approve the agenda. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

B. MINUTES

Moved by Comm. Hollekim, seconded by Comm. Olson, to approve the minutes of the September 21, 2021 and September 22, 2021 special meeting as corrected. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

C. FEES

F. GAMING AUTHORIZATION

G. NDSF

H. BEER & LIQUOR

Moved by Comm. Olson, seconded by Comm. Uran, to approve the beer & liquor transfer for Belden Chuckwagon LLC from Kubas Investments to Robin D Patch. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Comm. Uran, seconded by Comm. Olson, to un-table the request for an on-sale liquor license for the Belden Chuckwagon LLC. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Wade Enget, State's Attorney stated the Belden Chuckwagon LLC is licensed as a convenience store not a restaurant. Attorney Enget suggested the Board make revisions to the County liquor resolution-to clarify rules for consumption of alcohol on the premises.

Moved by Comm. Uran, seconded by Comm. Rice, to deny the on-sale liquor license for the Belden Chuckwagon LLC due to not fulfilling the requirements of having adequate space and 50% of the prepared meals are not consumed on the premises. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

I. BASEMENT REMODEL

Discussion was held on the contract with Dittbrenner Woodworking LLC for the remodeling of the basement. Brad Ellis, Building Supervisor discussed the door issues and mentioned the doors will need to be returned and reordered which will cause a delay in the project. Building Supervisor Ellis will continue to work with HA Thompson on adding heat to the west jail cells and will do self-plumbing, if allowed, or hire a contractor to remove plumbing in the vacated west jail cell.

The Commissioners agreed to send a letter to Pella Windows on the dissatisfaction of the windows installed in the basement remodel.
