Chairman Ruland called the meeting to order.

Stephanie A. Pappa, Planning & Zoning Administrator, Greg Nible, with Ruach Resources, Trevor Hunter, Michelle Phillips, Kelly Barnett, and Stephen Marchesi with Hess were present for the hearing pertaining to the zoning amendment.

Chairman Ruland opened the 10:00 A.M. public hearing to receive comments on the zoning request filed by Hess North Dakota Pipeline LLC, with concurrence from John M Moe, landowner, for an amendment to change land zoned agricultural to industrial for the purpose of building the East Nesson Compressor Station on a 56.02 acre, more or less, plat to be known as an Outlot 1 of the W½ of Section 6, Township 154 North, Range 94 West (Unorganized Township).

Stephanie A Pappa, Planning and Zoning Administrator presented the information from the February 25, 2019 Planning & Zoning Commission recommendation to the Mountrail County Commissioners to approve the zoning request filed by Hess North Dakota Pipeline LLC, with concurrence from John M Moe, landowner, for an amendment to change land zoned agricultural to industrial for the purpose of building the East Nesson Compressor Station on a 56.02 acre, more or less, plat to be known as Outlot 1 of the W½ of Section 6, Township 154 North, Range 94 West (Unorganized Township) contingent on approval from the Mountrail County Commissioners, the outlot plat being recorded, working with Mountrail County Road & Bridge on all new approaches and haul route agreements as Hess North Dakota Pipeline LLC has met all criteria as set forth in Article IV, Section III, of the Mountrail County Zoning Ordinance and is further contingent upon Hess North Dakota Pipeline LLC complying with all other regulations as set forth in the Mountrail County Zoning Ordinance.

Trevor Hunter, Crowley Fleck Attorney for Hess handed out material explaining the project and discussed some of the criteria set forth already completed. Mr. Hunter indicated he did engage with Williams County and they were favorable of project. Also, Mr. Hunter has been in contact with landowner and are working towards placement of trees on her property to provide a buffer. Stephen Marchesi with Hess discussed the project scope, timeline, and objectives.

Greg Nible from Ruach Resources stated was in support of this project.

Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Lori Hanson, Tax Director met with the board to discuss an abatement.

Moved by Comm. Uran, seconded by Comm. Olson, to approve the abatement on parcel 58-0042200 due to 100% Homestead credit for 2018 tax year. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried.

10:30 A.M.

Nichole Degenstein, Human Resource met with the board to discuss the Compensation and Performance Plan.
